

Freegal Music Mobile App

1. Download the free Freegal Music app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store.
2. Open the app. In the location search enter CANADA.
3. From the Please select your library list, choose Marigold Library System.
4. Log in with your library card barcode number and library PIN. *(If you do not know your library PIN, contact your local library.)*



What is Freegal Music?

Freegal Music is a digital media service available through your library that provides access to millions of songs from the Sony music catalogue and more!

- Download and keep up to five songs (MP3) per week
- Stream up to five hours per day, ad free!

How do I access Freegal Music from my PC/Mac?

1. Visit your library's website and look for the eResources menu link, or visit marigold.ab.ca/eResources.
2. From the alphabetical list, locate the link to Freegal Music.
3. Locate the Log In button at the top right. Login with your library card barcode and library PIN. *(If you do not know your library PIN, contact your local library.)*


Find Music

Find a song you want to download and select the download link.




Once downloaded, the song is yours to keep!
